“Our Volunteers are the Heroes”

The Chowan-Perquimans Habitat for Humanity ReStore, located at 1370 N Broad Street in Edenton provides the local community with a wide-ranging inventory of second-hand home goods, books, toys, sporting goods, furniture and much, much more. Inventory at the ReStore comes solely from local donations, so you can find a wide-ranging variety of constantly-changing goods at the ReStore.

Proceeds from the ReStore help to fund building projects for the Chowan-Perquimans Habitat for Humanity, an all-volunteer, non-denominational Christian housing ministry that has been providing affordable housing to our local community for twenty-six years.

The ReStore operates with a staff of mostly volunteers from the local community. It is open 3 days a week, but volunteers work throughout the week delivering, stocking and organizing donations as well as maintaining the facility.

“Our volunteers are the heroes of this operation,” said new ReStore manager, Earl Hollowell, “There are at least a couple of our volunteers who are well past the retirement age putting in lots of hours on a weekly basis.”

Meet two Volunteers: Erie Downing Jr. has served on the Chowan/Perquimans H4H board for close to fifteen years, working on the Construction Committee and assisting wherever he’s needed.

Erie’s wife, Hattie, a board member for eight years, is the Family Selection Committee Chairperson and serves on the family selection Committee. She supports our partner families, advocating on their behalf and lending guidance and encouragement to new homeowners. Hattie also provides outreach to our community spreading the word about Habitat and seeking new volunteers. Erie and Hattie volunteer at the ReStore, at least four days a week for a minimum of 4 hours each day. Erie is familiar with tools and other hardware so he volunteers mainly outdoors and Hattie says she follows Erie’s lead (mostly). Erie also assists in pick-ups after the store is closed so his volunteerism goes above and beyond.

Mike Finamore, CPH4H Board President, said that Erie and Hatti were instrumental in the recent ReStore renovations. They stepped-in when the store closed for rehab and worked along with other volunteers to clean, sort and organize the ReStore’s inventory. They have volunteered every day since the re-opening of the ReStore in March of 2022.

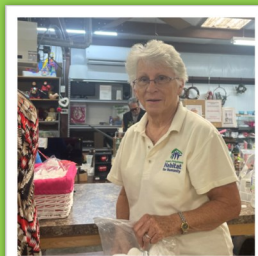
When asked about her experience as a ReStore volunteer, Hattie said, “It has been a blessing for us to get to know the families we serve, and know that we serve God by serving our fellow man. It takes time, and most of all commitment in order to serve. I look forward to getting up on Restore days, knowing that I will meet new people and see old faces. I love to talk with all the customers. Erie is a Jack of all trades. If he can’t fix it, you might as well replace it. He even shares information with the customers as to how to install, replace, or fix things at their homes with purchased items.”
